13	One shallow frame of honey suitable for extraction. (Must be displayed in a bee-proof case – the comb must be visible from both sides).	
14	Three matching beeswax blocks between 25g and 30g.	
15	One Beeswax block, minimum weight 226g. May be polished.	
16	Three matching dipped beeswax candles (displayed erect - one may be lit, at the judge's discretion). To be displayed flat on white paper plate.	
17	Three matching moulded beeswax candles (displayed erect - one may be lit, at the judge's discretion). To be displayed flat on white paper plate.	
18	One bottle of dry or sweet mead (please state on the label which it is)	
19	One bottle of alcoholic drink based on honey – please provide details of other ingredients.	

	Craft and Honey Cookery Section	
20	OPEN: Honey Cake – Made according to recipe in schedule.	
21	OPEN: Eight (8) Honey Sweets. Either provide recipe (which must use honey) or use recipe in schedule for honey fudge. Recipe to be displayed.	
22	Six biscuits (made using honey) – recipe to be displayed.	
23	One jar of honey marmalade, recipe to be displayed. Any size of jar may be used. Commercially produced fruit pulp i.e. 'Ma Made' is not permitted to be used.	
24	A Honey Label. A standard label of your own design, actual size, to fit on a standard 1lb jar or 12oz HEX jar produced in any medium to comply with current UK regulations to be displayed either flat or on an empty honey jar. Must include appropriate Lot Number/Best Before date as if the honey were from the current season. Labels will be judged against the Honey Label regulations 2015 as interpreted by Bedfordshire Trading Standards.	
25	Any Interesting or Instructive Exhibit related to bees or beekeeping (NOT including live bees).	
26	A Display of Beeswax, minimum 6 pieces – NOT to include Candles in any form. The attractiveness of the display will be taken into account when judging. Maximum 20cm x 20cm space allowed per entry.	
27	Craft Display Class: Three different items which utilise bee products and show the skill of the exhibitor. Each to be displayed with a brief description.	
28	Craft Class: A practical item made or invented by the exhibitor directly related to bees, beekeeping, or bee products. To be displayed with a brief explanation.	
29	OPEN: A Limerick about bees or beekeeping. Sub class Open to Redborne Students. Please add Name and Class/Year Group on rear of entry

31	Photographic class: A macro or close-up photograph of a honeybees showing at least two castes of honeybees (at least two of: queen, worker and drone).	
32	Photographic Class: A Black and white photograph of bees or beekeeping.	
33	One photomicrograph or Micro print (in colour or black and white) with the subject of honeybee anatomy or pollen grains (brief description to be provided on the back).	
34	One Microscope slide 3"x 1" subject bee anatomy or pollen grains (brief description on slide label).

35	Three Cupcakes to be decorated with a bee themed design.	
36	One 454g (1lb) Jar of honey – entrant to have helped with the bees, extraction and bottling
